Language and Literacy

<u>Reading</u> – using novels and poetry books. Guided reading sessions will take place in class and pupils will also be set pages to read every evening. This area also includes comprehension activities during which pupils will be asked to justify their responses logically with reference to evidence within the text.

Writing – writing for a variety of purposes and audiences. Expressing thoughts, feelings and opinions in an imaginative and factual writing. Pupils will also develop competences in the use of grammar and punctuation to create clarity of meaning. To help improve their independent spelling we will be using 'The Complete Spelling Programme'. Spelling activities will be completed in class to consolidate the learning. A daily spelling test will be completed in class, with the use of a dictation as part of their Friday test.

<u>Talking and Listening</u> – class, group and paired activities in both talking and listening. Pupils should show an awareness of their audience when giving an oral presentation including the use of multimedia presentations.

Mathematics and Numeracy

<u>Processes</u> – communicating mathematically, understanding mathematical language, developing different approaches to problem solving.

<u>Number</u> – four operations, times tables, place value, fractions, decimals, percentages, money.

<u>Shape and Space</u> – properties of 2D and 3D shapes, lines and angles, compass and direction, co-ordinates, tessellations, line and rotational symmetry. Using ICT to understand movement and to generate shapes, pictures and patterns.

Data Handling – using a range of tables and charts, spreadsheets and data bases to interrogate and interpret results. Finding the probability of events using fractions.

<u>Measures</u> – length, weight, capacity, volume, temperature, scale/area, perimeter, time (12 hour and 24 hour) and timetables.





Homework Routine

- Written/Learning homework: set Mon Thurs and returned the next day.

Class Assessments

- The first assessments will take place during January/February and the results will be discussed during Parent-Teacher interviews in February.
- Assessments will also be completed in May and the results will be recorded in the Pupil Profile in June.

- All pupils will be set individual targets. These targets will be discussed with the pupils and will be displayed on their desk.
- The targets will be reviewed termly(by both pupil and teacher) and new targets will be set.
