Well done to all the children for working hard at 'being helpful'. During January we will be thinking about 'good manners'.



TOGETHER TIME

Physical Development

- * Develop bilateral integration by finding activities that require using each hand for a different purpose e.g. cutting scraps (one hand to hold the card, another to cut), building a tower (one hand to steady, the other to connect), dressing a doll (one hand to hold the doll, the other to pull on the clothing).
- * We will be continuing to butter our snack in nursery. Please practise this skill at home with your child.
- * Develop your child's fine motor and hand-eye coordination by encouraging them to zip their own coat.

The Arts

- * Cut up old Christmas cards to develop scissor skills and use glue to create a winter collage.
- * Develop your child's representational and observational skills by encouraging him/her to find a favourite toy picture or a favourite book character etc. and to draw it, paying attention to shape, size and colour of its various parts.

The World Around Us

- * Talk about and encourage exploration of winter e.g. How is ice made? Where do polar animals live?
- * Discuss different types of clothes for different purposes e.g. cold weather, party/fancy dress clothes.

Early Mathematical Experiences

- * Encourage your child to recall events occurring over the Christmas holidays to develop awareness of passing of time.
- * Highlight numbers to your child e.g. looking at road signs and house numbers when out for a walk or in the car, when reading a book, on everyday items e.g. watches, scales, clothes and shoes. Encourage him/her to talk about number in relation to him/herself e.g. age.
