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<u>MARK – MAKING</u>

Some children are attempting to write their names on their work, so when your child is ready, try to encourage him/her to do the following:

-When using drawing/painting tools use a tripod grip, held near the base (we call it a "Aly Alligator" – please refer to video posted on Seesaw)

-With the exception of the first letter of their name, which should be a capital, use lower case letters - it's much easier to promote good habits than undo "bad habits"!

-Move the drawing tool from left to right. Putting a little dot on the left side of the page often helps.

-Praise all attempts as progress is being made!

In nursery we seek to foster a love of and an interest in mark making. More formal letter formation will be taught in P1.

SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES FOR YOUR CHILD

Language Development

• Encourage looking out for print in the environment e.g. shop signs, vehicle registration, story books, and talk about their meaning

<u>The Arts</u>

• Create a basic map showing the route to and from school. Cut out or draw pictures of landmarks and mark out their journey

Physical Development

- Explore patterns using dots, vertical, horizontal and zigzag lines. If your child needs a challenge, encourage cutting along lines
- Use masking tape to create straight and zigzag lines on the ground for your child to walk/hop along and balance

Early Mathematical Experiences

• Go for a walk with your child, encouraging him/her to point out familiar landmarks and places and support the use of directional and positional language to describe where you are going e.g. "turning up the road", "the bakery is opposite the butchers", and "the trees are in front of the school", etc.
