



#### TOGETHER TIME

#### PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT & MOVEMENT

Continue to practise getting dressed and undressed (focusing on buttons, zips etc.), use scissors, a range of writing tools and smaller equipment. This will not only promote independence but will improve the strength and dexterity of your child's fingers in readiness for forming letters and numbers in preparation for P1.

#### THE ARTS

Make use of a range of junk material e.g. tubes, boxes, bottle tops, encouraging your child to think about creating buildings, vehicles, people, animals or robots.

#### EARLY MATHEMATICAL EXPERIENCES

- Use different types of construction equipment in combination (e.g. Lego, wooden blocks) to develop awareness of shape and space.
- Talk about shapes and numbers in the environment, both 2D and 3D, e.g. traffic signs, shapes of food items, buildings, numbers on signs and registration plates.
- Collect stones and shells to sort and count.

#### LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT

- Perhaps you could visit the library.
- Remember to keep reading to your child. Encourage them to retell the story in their own words.
- Maybe you could make props and act out favourite stories.


