The children will discuss their photographs in class and we will then display these in the classroom. Please ensure all photographs are named.



Over the coming weeks the children will be introduced to our nursery 'Golden Rules'. These will be displayed in the classrooms and in the cloakroom area. Please take time to talk to your child about these important rules. We will be reinforcing them on a daily basis in nursery.



OUTDOOR PLAY

To make the most of learning experiences outdoors, we ask that parents send in a warm coat, with a hood and a pair of wellies. Please remember to put your child's name on all items. Outdoor play clothes can be given to a member of staff in a plastic bag and will be left in nursery for when they are needed, for play outside. These will be stored in our indoor cloakroom and will not go between home and school.

MORNING ROUTINE

When arriving at nursery please encourage your child to look for their labelled coat hook and hang up their coat and bag. This will promote early reading and personal skills as well as giving your child a sense of achievement and independence!

PLEASE REMEMBER



- The wearing of appropriate clothing.
- Naming ALL items of uniform and outdoor clothing.
- To provide a full change of clothes at all times. These will be left in a bag on your child's peg in the indoor cloakroom. Wet soiled clothes will be sent home in a plastic bag. Please remember to send another change of spare clothes into nursery the following day.
- Prompt arrival and collection of your child at the beginning and end of the session to minimise distress.
- Contacting the nursery in event of your child not being able to attend via the Seesaw app or on 93 369812.
- Encourage your child's independence by allowing him/her to hang up items of clothing.
- $\circ~$ To complete and return all forms ASAP.
- \circ To inform staff of any allergies or medical/dietary needs that your child may have.


