-  Snuggle up with a good book - We appreciate that costumes can be expensive! So this year, children from Nursery-Primary 7 should come to school wearing 'something cosy'. They can also bring in their favourite book from home as each class will have the chance to 'snuggle up' with their favourite book during the day. Feel free to bring in a blanket or small teddy too!
-  Book Donation - As you can imagine, it costs a lot of money to maintain a school library...and ours desperately needs some new books! In order to help with this, if you have any children's books at home that your child no longer reads (but are still in good condition) and would like to donate them to our school library then we will happily take them off your hands! Books should be sent in to the class teacher on World Book Day or can be left in the school office if you think they would be too heavy for your child to carry.
-  Competition - Design a Finger Puppet to represent a character from a book. This week, Primary 1-7 children will be given a planning page to design their character at home. They will then use these plans in their classroom on World Book Day to create a finger puppet. Prizes will be awarded for the most creative characters in each class.
-  The children will all receive a paper copy of the Scholastic Book Club Magazine and a £1 off book token which can be redeemed against any purchase. Congratulations to our P5-P7 pupils who recently participated in NSPCC Rocks – a times tables competition run by Times Tables Rock Stars. NSPCC Rocks required children to correctly answer as many multiplication and division questions as possible, to give their class and school the best chance of winning.

The competition was fierce with 85,843,080 questions answered collectively by 277,401 pupils from more than 3,870 schools and 22,268 classes around the country!

Our school ranked in the top 12% which was an amazing achievement!
